

RISK MATRIX - PEREGRINE FORESIGHT

IMPACT

1	Negligible	Minor disruption to activities which has no impact on the overall trip (eg: small loss of money, short delay.) Can be dealt with by the traveller with no additional support. No media interest.
2	Minor	Minor injury or ill health. Minor disruption to trip activities. May require the support of insurers or the TMC but routine issue.
3	Moderate	Injury or ill health requiring medical treatment. Loss of critical equipment or data. Significant disruption to the trip itinerary. May generate minor media attention. Traveller's department and University will be required to support the recovery.
4	Major	Loss of life or serious injury requiring hospitalisation. Requires immediate cancellation of trip activities. Major disruption to the research/project, requiring a long recovery period. Local media coverage. University travel crisis management plan required to support recovery.
5	Critical	Numerous loss of lives or life threatening injuries, prolonged detention or captivity. Emergency evacuation required. Significant damage to the University's credibility or integrity. Complete loss of ability to continue with research / project. National media coverage. Activation of University travel crisis management plan.

LIKLIHOOD

1	Rare	A highly unlikely event; it would be very surprising if it happened. There would have to be a combination of unlikely events for this to happen.
2	Unlikely	An unlikely event that remains a possibility under normal circumstances (eg: it could occur if a traveller was particularly unlucky or naïve but would usually be prevented by the usual travel safety awareness.)
3	Possible	An event which has a reasonable chance of happening (eg: incidents usually occur once or twice a year but are not routine and the traveller profile has no specific vulnerability.)
4	Likely	An event which has a high probability of occurring (eg: it happens every few months or recent warnings have been issued, and/or the traveller profile could be a target.)
5	Almost Certain	An event which will occur or is highly likely to happen without specific action being taken (eg: it happens frequently in that region, is expected to occur, and/or the travellers profile has a high vulnerability to targeted threats.)

OVERALL

(1-4)	Insignificant	Minimal levels of risk which do not require additional precautions. Approved at Departmental level
(5-9)	Low	Minor levels of risk which can be managed by general travel safety measures. Approved at Departmental level.
(10-14)	Moderate	Significant levels of risk which require specific actions by the traveller to manage. Mitigations and precautions should be taken to reduce the risk. Approved at Departmental level.
(15-19)	High	High levels of risk which require very careful planning to determine precautions to reduce or manage these risks. Must be referred to SARAC for review.
20+	Extreme	Extreme levels of risk including potential for loss of life and where very careful planning and precautions must be taken to reduce or manage the risks. Must be referred to SARAC for review.
